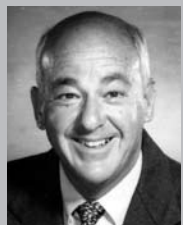
Keynote Speakers



Dr. Henry C. Lee is the Chief Emeritus Director of the Connecticut State Police Forensic Laboratory. He is professor of the Forensic Science program at the University of New Haven, a program which he created in 1975. He has served on national and international committees in forensic science, criminal justice, education, and training. Dr. Lee has over 800 workshops/seminars to his credit, has investigated over 6,000 major cases worldwide, and has testified over 1,000 times in criminal and civil cases. He serves more than 3,000 agencies as a consultant.



Dr. Michael Welner, M.D. As chairman of The Forensic Panel, he founded the first and only peer review forensic expert consultation practice in the country. Most recently, he developed The Depravity Scale, a device currently being validated for the psychological determination of evil. Dr. Welner specializes in violent patients and those who fail to respond to treatment. He has consulted in a number of high profile cases, including the death of heiress Doris Duke, the Wyoming homicide of Matthew Shepard and the mass murders at a Xerox facility in Hawaii.



Dr. Cyril H. Wecht, M.D., J.D. is the former Coroner of Allegheny County, and one of the world's leading experts in forensic pathology. He has been consulted in numerous high profile cases. As a medical-legal expert, Dr. Wecht has performed approximately 14,000 autopsies and has supervised, reviewed or been consulted on approximately 30,000 additional post-mortem examinations. He is the author of more than 475 professional publications, along with the popular non-fiction books *Cause of Death*, *Grave Secrets*, *Who Killed JonBenet Ramsey?*, *Mortal Evidence* and *Tales from the Morgue*.



Dr. Frank Minyard, M.D. has served as Coroner of Orleans Parish since 1974. He was a Clinical Associate Professor for Obstetrics and Gynecology at Tulane School of Medicine and a Clinical Associate Professor for Emergency Medicine and Pathology at LSU. Dr. Minyard retired with the rank of Captain from the U.S. Navy. He is the author of many Forensic articles and booklets. Dr. Minyard is also the author of the Louisiana Coroner's Handbook and is President of the Board of Directors of the New Orleans Katrina Memorial Corporation.

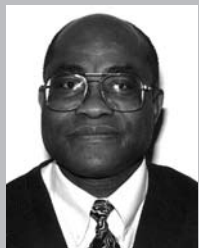

Featured Speakers



Dr. Matthias I. Okoye, M.D., J.D. is a practicing physician and lawyer, and the Director of the Nebraska Institute of Forensic Sciences, Inc., and Nebraska Forensic Medical Services, P.C. He is Clinical Associate Professor of forensic pathology at Creighton University School of Medicine, Omaha, Nebraska. He is also an adjunct professor of forensic medicine and pathology at several universities abroad. He was formerly the Chief Medical Examiner for the District of Columbia, Washington, D.C. He is a consultant forensic pathologist with the State of Nebraska's Office of the Attorney General, and serves as a coroner's physician and forensic pathologist for several Nebraska counties.



Mr. Larry R. Bedore, M.S. CJ earned his Bachelor's degree in Biology at the Franciscan University of Steubenville (Ohio) and he completed his Master's Degree in Criminal Justice with Nova University. Mr. Bedore has been a member of the federal DMORT program since 1994 and assisted the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner during the World Trade Center Disaster response. He served as Planning Chief for the Mississippi DMORT response to Hurricane Katrina in 2005. Mr. Bedore was part of the original working group to establish the Florida Emergency Mortuary Operations Response System (FEMORS) in 2002 and became its first Commander in 2003.



Dr. Mark W. Perlin, M.D., Ph.D. develops biomedical information and automation technologies. He has been working in the area of computational genetics for over 15 years. Dr. Perlin invented linear mixture analysis and deconvolution-based STR genotyping technologies for forensic DNA interpretation. As founder and CEO of Cybergentics, he directs the development of the TrueAllele® system for automated computer review of casework and databank DNA data, which he is currently using to reanalyze DNA data from the World Trade Center mass disaster. Dr. Perlin also invented the inner product mapping method for rapidly building genome clone maps, and led the project that produced the first genome map for human chromosome 11.



Dr. Steven C. Batterman, Ph.D. was the first engineer in the world to be elected president of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences. Dr. Batterman's areas of expertise include accident reconstruction, occupant kinematics, vehicle dynamics, biomechanics, mechanics of human injury, crash worthiness, restraint systems, products liability, safety engineering and human factors. Additional expertise is in mechanics of solids and structures, including stress analysis, buckling and stability, failure analysis, structural dynamics, impact, mechanical and structural design. Dr. Batterman holds numerous academic honors and awards, has published extensively and enjoys international recognition as an engineering consultant and one of the leading forensic engineers of our time.



Dr. Jan Leestma, M.D. is a board certified forensic neuropathologist and the co-founder and chief medical officer of Nyxis Neurotherapies, Inc., Chicago, Illinois. He is also a member of Board of Directors of Naurex, Inc. He is the recipient of numerous academic awards in neuropathology and the author of the treatise *Forensic Neuropathology*, as well as over 100 other publications in pathology and neuropathology. He has served as consultant and forensic expert in numerous trials. He was the consultant neuropathologist for the University of Chicago, State of Maryland Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP), Cook County Medical Examiner, D.C. Medical Examiner, and other offices around the U.S. and abroad.



Dr. Thomas L. Bennett, M.D. is a Board-Certified Forensic Pathologist and Associate Medical Examiner in Billings, Montana. He was formerly State Medical Examiner for Iowa. He has been consulted in numerous homicide cases in several states and foreign countries. Dr. Bennett has lectured and published extensively in the fields of forensic sciences and forensic pathology. He obtained his M.D. from the University of Iowa and took his residency in pathology at the Case Western University School of Medicine and his fellowship in forensic pathology at the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for the State of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, NC.



Dr. David McCann, M.D. was appointed chief medical officer of the Florida One Disaster Medical Assistance Team in the U.S. Department of Homeland Security in 2004, and is the newly elected chair of the American Board of Disaster Medicine. Dr. McCann is also an instructor at the Department of Homeland Security's Center for Domestic Preparedness at Fort McClellan, as well as a National Disaster Life Support Instructor. He is also an Advanced HAZMAT Life Support Instructor and a VA Decontamination Course Instructor. Dr. McCann is an accomplished professional speaker and teacher, and a co-founder of Disaster Life Support of North America, Inc., a corporation dedicated to disaster preparation, planning response and recovery education for businesses and communities nationwide.



Dr. Michael J. Chambliss, M.D. is a board certified forensic pathologist at the Fresno County Coroner's Office. He obtained his M.D. degree from Southern Illinois University School of Medicine, Carbondale, Illinois and took his residency pathology at Michael Reese Hospital and Medical Center, Chicago, IL prior to taking a microbiology fellowship at Northwestern University, and then a fellowship in forensic pathology at the Cook County Medical Examiner's Office. He was formerly the Waukesha County Medical Examiner. He has consulted and lectured extensively and published in forensic pathology.

Dr. Cordelia N. Okoye was the Manager, Community Health Division, Lancaster County–City of Lincoln Health Department, Lincoln, Nebraska. She obtained her BA in Business Administration at Columbia College, Columbia, Missouri, a Master's of Public Health (MPH) degree from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, Tennessee, and her Ph.D. in Health Services from Walden University, Minneapolis, MN. Dr. Okoye is a founding member of the Nebraska Institute Board of Directors and currently serves as its Executive Vice President.



Professor John O. Obafunwa, M.D., F.R.C.Path, L.L.B. is the Professor and Head of Department of Morbid Anatomy and the Provost of the Lagos State University College of Medicine, Ikeja, Lagos, Nigeria. Professor Obafunwa was the State Pathologist for Cayman Islands and the Republic of Bermuda. He is a member of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences and also a delegate to the International Academy of Legal Medicine. He is a member of the British Association of Forensic Pathologists and the World Association of Police Surgeons.



Dr. John Filippi, D.D.S., A.B.F.O. is a forensic dentist and dental consultant for the State of Nebraska. Dr. Filippi's first involvement in mass disaster dental identifications was in 1989 with United Flight 232, in Sioux City, Iowa. Since 1991, and his affiliation with the NDMS/DMORT System, he has been actively involved with multiple cemetery desecrations as well as six commercial airline disasters. His experiences also include two tours of service at the World Trade Center/ 911 and Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans. Dr. Filippi is a member of the Board of Governors for the American Society of Forensic Odontology.



Dr. Erin Kimmerle is an Assistant Professor of Anthropology at the University of South Florida. She earned her M.A. in Anthropology at the University of Nebraska and her Ph.D. in Anthropology from the University of Tennessee. Dr. Kimmerle served as Forensic Anthropologist in Kosovo and as the Chief Anthropologist in Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina for the United Nations, International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY). Kimmerle has worked as a forensic consultant on cases throughout the United States, Bermuda and the Balkans.



Dr. Chris Long, Ph.D. is the Chief Forensic Toxicologist and Associate Professor at St. Louis University School of Medicine, St. Louis, MO where he directs the toxicology laboratories of several counties for the State of Missouri. He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences and has published and lectured extensively in forensic Toxicology. He has been involved in the toxicologic analyses of specimens in several mass disasters.



Dr. Thomas Young, M.D. As the Jackson County Medical Examiner for 11 1/2 years, Dr. Young served as the chief death investigator for metropolitan Kansas City on the Missouri side of the state line. He obtained for the office full accreditation by the National Association of Medical Examiners. The office remains the only nationally accredited death investigation agency in Missouri. Dr. Young has assisted in several mass disasters and is the former director of a nationally accredited forensic pathology training program..



Dr. Kalu Ogbureke, D.D.S, FDS, Ph.D., J.D. Dr. Ogbureke earned a bachelor's and doctorate of dental surgery degree from the University of Ibadan in Nigeria, a master's degree in medical science from the University of Glasgow in Scotland, a doctorate of medical science from Harvard University, and a juris doctorate from Suffolk University Law School in Boston. He completed a postdoctoral fellowship in dental surgery at England's Royal College of Surgeons, and earned a graduate certificate in the business of medicine from Johns Hopkins University.



Mr. Bassel El-Kasaby, Esq. As Senior partner of the law firm of Kasaby & Nicholls, Mr. El-Kasaby practices in the areas of immigration law, employment law, civil rights, and aviation law. He received his B.S., his M.S., with distinction, and his J.D., with distinction, from the University of Iowa. He is a former faculty member at the University of Nebraska at Omaha Aviation Institute, involved in teaching and research on aviation law, policy, and regulation. He has published on issues involving aviation law, insurance, and passenger rights.



Ms. Chizoma R. Opara, Esq. is a Staff Attorney with the American Bar Association (ABA-Africa), Abuja, Nigeria— an implementing partner for the Anti-Trafficking in Persons (TIP) project of US Agency for International Development (USAID). She is responsible for conducting extensive legal research for various TIP projects, drafting and presenting case studies for educational materials on human trafficking and child abuse and exploitation; maintained and distributed to various law enforcement agencies.



Mr. Mark Roper is a fourth generation funeral director at Roper & Sons Funeral Home in Lincoln NE. He has been a mortuary officer member of DMORT, the Disaster Mortuary Operational Response Team, since 1995 and has been activated on responses to Guam Korean Airline disaster in 1997, World Trade Center 2001, Kirksville Missouri American Airlines accident in 2004, and Hurricane Katrina 2005. 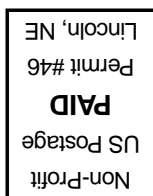
