All Proposals must include:

1. Cover sheet with
 - Title of proposed presentation or panel discussion.
 - Name(s) and title(s) of the presenter(s)/panelist(s)
 - Contact information: phone, fax, e-mail and mail address (i.e., whom should we contact)
 - Paragraph (50 words or fewer) describing the content of the session to be used on the conference web site.
2. Brief biographical sketch of each presenter (one-half page maximum for each person)
3. Typed, double-spaced abstract of the presentation, 500-800 words in length, with only the proposed session title for identification purposes. Do not include the name(s) or title(s) of presenters in the title of the abstract

Proposals will be reviewed throughout the submission period. Notification of acceptance will be made by September 1, 2005. All presenters will be required to pre-register for the conference at a discounted rate.
